

This article includes a discussion of the Wheelers' excavations at Devil's Dyke in 1932, including a list of the finds made – "Sherds of upwards of 500 pots were found in the trial trenches at Wheathampstead", "a bronze brooch ... may be of mid-Gaulish origin", "a pair of bronze tweezers ... of the elemental type which is familiar on Late Bronze Age, Early Iron Age, and Roman sites", "a fragment of an iron knife-blade ... of normal Early Iron-Age type...and a clay spindle-whorl ... of a flat form which is rare before the last phase of the Early Iron Age in this country."
